Update for Residents from the Lambertville City Pipeline Committee


Dear Residents,

Thank you for attending the Lambertville City Council meeting about the PennEast Pipeline on Thursday, 10th November. It was a long meeting but so much great information. Thanks to Sue Begent from the Lambertville City Council Pipeline Committee, Jeff Tittel from the Sierra Club (Lambertville resident), David Fournier from SUEZ, (Lambertville resident) and Steve Mars, Senior Biologist from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service – New Jersey Field Office.

There are 4 things of note in this letter: (1) an important FERC DEIS update, (2) most importantly, a call to action to INTERVENE!; (3) a reminder of the HALT Talks Professor Onstott fundraiser on 30th November at Rago Arts and Auction Center, and (4) note of a change in leadership of the City Pipeline Committee.

1) FERC DEIS update:

- On 23rd November PennEast submitted their construction-related heavy-traffic plans to FERC. See below for Lambertville specifically. Roads highlighted in pink are designated “Heavy haul roads”
- As you can see, significant impact would be expected for Lambertville residents, and local businesses, with major congestion and road damage.
