Collections every Monday. Wet waste should be bagged. All waste placed in green can.

Meat, Poultry (including bones), Fish (including bones and shellfish)
Dairy Products
Flower & Vegetable Garden Waste
Houseplants & Flower Bouquets
Fruits & Nuts (including pits)
Vegetables
Bread, Pasta & Grains
Liquids & Sauces
Coffee Grounds & Filters

Recycling

Collected with garbage. All items must be clean. No plastic bags or bagging of items.

Plastics marked with either #1 or #2 recycle symbol (where neck is narrower than body)
Plastic Beverage Bottles, Milk Jugs, Detergent & Shampoo containers (lids are ok)
Glass food & Beverage Jars/Bottles
Clean Paper
Clean Newspaper
Clean Cardboard
Clean Aluminum Foil & Foil Containers
Junk Mail
Envelopes (window envelopes are ok)
