PROCLAMATION
DISASTER/EMERGENCY

To ALL CITIZENS and PERSONS within the City of Lambertville, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, NEW JERSEY, and to ALL DEPARTMENTS, DIVISIONS, AND BUREAUS of the MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT of the City of Lambertville, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the powers vested in me by Chapter 251 of the Laws of 1942, as amended and supplemented, N.J.S.A. App. A:9-30 et seq.; N.J.S.A. 40:48-1 (6) and ordinances enacted pursuant thereto; N.J.S.A. 2C:33-1 et seq., and by Resolutions adopted by the City of Lambertville, I have declared a local disaster emergency exists within the City of Lambertville; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid laws authorize the promulgation of such orders, rules and regulations as are necessary to meet the various problems which have, or may be presented by such emergency; and

WHEREAS, due to a pending severe snow and ice storm in the City of Lambertville, County of Hunterdon, which conditions may affect the health, safety, and welfare of the people of the City of Lambertville; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the area(s) of the City of Lambertville should then be declared disaster areas, and further certain measures must be taken to ensure that the authorities will not be unhampered in their efforts to maintain law and order, as well as to protect the persons and property of the residents affected by the conditions; and

WHEREAS, all of the City of Lambertville has been placed in a state of emergency,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Robert Brown, Emergency Management Coordinator for the City of Lambertville, New Jersey, in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the people of the City of Lambertville in the State of New Jersey do hereby indicate that a State of Emergency exists and will continue to exist in the City of Lambertville, and I hereby ORDER AND DIRECT the following:

1. Allow for parking restrictions on all City roadways if needed.
2. The ability for City Police to remove vehicles hindering any emergency operations, or parked on City roadways.
3. The ability for the city police to tow or ticket any vehicle in violation of this order.
4. The ability to limit travel on all City roadways if conditions or circumstances dictate.
5. The ability to request all emergency services to be staffed with in-house personnel.
6. The ability to obtain resources outside of the contractual regulations
7. The ability to recall essential employees as needed
8. Enable work at home capabilities for key employees.
