- 4. Approval of December Minutes Not carried out
- 5. Oath of Office Alexis Berends, Patricia Walker Both Not Present
- 6. Public Comment Lindsay Hansche and Michael Harriott both commented regarding the formation of Adult Sports Leagues. It was noted that there is a Women's Voleyball pickup on Monday evenings at LPS. Basketball was suggested in the LPS gym and there was agreement it starts as a meet-up/open night to determine interest. In warmer weather, the basketball court in Ely Park is also an option. There would need to be someone to run it. Overall, the proposal was well received.

Mayor Andrew Nowick thanked the Commission for their work over the last year and thought it was amazing. He "thinks the world of what we're doing for the City."

Mayor Nowick also reported the City received a grant for an Augmented Reality walking tour of flooding impact. He suggested expanding the scope of the tour to include Ely Creek and Cherry St. Park.

 - 1. Interpretive signs 2 have been suggested running between \$1,000 \$1,500 each.

- Mary Sheridan Park There is \$16,000 left to spend for improvements.
 - i. Jamie Fox memorial All liked the proposed design. It will cost about \$2,000.
 - ii. Seed lawn Seed mix for shade and traffic
 - iii. Landscape improvements George Street side of park and around gazebo Appropriate plantings to be done by volunteers, some shrubs may be done by professionals.
- Ely Park
 - i. Gaga court repairs Not settled. Estimates for repairs are very high. A new court runs about \$2600. This is tabled for the time being.
 - ii. Gaga court flooring Not a priority. Mayor Nowick suggested not replacing the floor and leaving it as concrete, since this is what is recommended by Gaga court vendors. He will interface with LPS if necessary.

 - Application for County Open Space Funds Will be submitted 1/12. Asking for \$180,000. May be notified by early February.
 - RFP for proposed phase 1 trails: west and south of current entrance Will be issued after we hear results from Application for County Open Space Funds

*Local Recreation Improvement Grant funds will be awarded to successful grant applicants to help cover costs associated with updating community centers, playgrounds, pools, fields, walking or bicycle trails, rail trails, multi-sport courts, and recreational facilities; one-time personnel costs directly related to improvements; project development professional services costs; equipment costs including playground and recreation facilities equipment; and environmental remediation costs required to prepare recreation sites for use.
